

My child is reading level W books!

What does that mean?

It means <u>Level W</u> text demonstrates characteristics such as:

- Themes explore the human condition
- Fiction and nonfiction texts present characters who learn lessons from hardships
- Writing is sophisticated, with complex sentences, literary language, and symbolism
- Print in a small font
- Background knowledge of social and political issues to comprehend texts
- Informational texts may present complex information that requires more extensive content knowledge
- Narrative biographies include many details that require readers to make inferences
- Character interpretation is essential to understanding the theme

How can I support my child in reading?

I can help by listening, noticing when my child uses good reading strategies, and saying:

- "You made that part sound interesting."
- "You used the glossary/graphic to figure it out."
- "You noticed it had two meanings."
- "You imagined what that word or phrase might look like in order to understand."
- "You had a question and you read to answer it."

After reading, I can say:

- "Why is this topic important to you or not important to you?"
- "If you were the author, how might you have changed a part of the book? Why would you change that?"
- "What are you still wondering? What would you still like to know about this topic?"
