

My child is reading level X books!

What does that mean?

It means Level X text demonstrates characteristics such as:

- Variety of genres such as fantasy and science fiction, realistic fiction, traditional literature (myths, legends), biographies, autobiographies, memoirs, mysteries, historical fiction, short stories, genre combinations (hybrids), diaries, satire
- Multiple themes that may be understood in many layers
- Challenging themes that build social awareness and reveal insights into the human condition
- Long stretches of descriptive language that are important to the setting, characters and a full range of literary devices (e.g., flashback, stories within stories, symbolism, and figurative language)
- Struggle between good and evil
- Switching from setting to setting, including time change

How can I support my child in reading?

I can help by listening, noticing when my child uses good reading strategies, and saying:

- "You remembered that from the other day when you were reading."
- "You noticed it had two meanings."
- "You made your voice match the character and punctuation."
- "You noticed the author wasn't being literal, it was figurative language."
- "You thought about what made sense."

After reading, I can say:

- "Show me something that was new or surprising."
- "What are you still wondering?/What would you still like to know about this topic?"
- "How did the character or problem change during the story?"
- "Talk about what the book made you think about (other books or experiences)."
- "Talk about some facts you remember about the topic."
