

My child is reading level Y books!

What does that mean?

It means Level Y text demonstrates characteristics such as:

- Complex fantasy, myths, and legends offer added challenge and require readers to identify themes and moral issues
- Biographies offer range of admirable and unsavory individuals requiring critical thinking and evaluation
- Themes and characters are multidimensional, may be understood on several levels, and developed in complex ways
- Multiple themes considered in many layers
- Long string of unassigned dialogue from which story action must be inferred
- Many technical words that are difficult to decode
- Texts with heroic or larger-than-life characters who represent struggle between good and evil

How can I support my child in reading?

I can help by listening, noticing when my child uses good reading strategies, and saying:

- "You imagined what that word or phrase might look like in order to understand."
- "You remembered that from the other day when you were reading."
- "You made that part sound interesting."
- "You noticed that it had two meanings."
- "You made your voice match the punctuation and the story."

After reading, I can say:

- "What kind of person is (character name)? How were they the same or different from someone else in the story?"
- "What are you still wondering? What would you still like to know about this topic?"
- "Talk about the facts you remember about the topic?"
- "If you were the author, how could you have changed a part of the book? Why would you change that part?"
